

Psychology BA at a Glance

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Program Overview:

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology offers training in how to understand human behavior using scientifically rigorous methods. It reflects current trends in the field of psychology through its emphasis on the science of psychology (integrated via the research sequence) and through the inclusion of recent trends in psychological theory and practice (such as child psychopathology, environmental psychology, and legal psychology). Students have a variety of opportunities to become directly involved in ongoing research, participate in our active student organizations, and conduct their own studies through our research labs.

Many pursue the B.A. in Psychology in preparation for graduate or professional training in psychology, social work, education, law, medicine, business, and other disciplines. Students also obtain the B.A. in Psychology to prepare for work in paraprofessional jobs under the direction of licensed or certified professionals. The department also offers MS and PhD degrees in a variety of Psychology areas.

- Introduction to Psychology: PSY 2012
- Another lower division (1000/2000 level) psychology course
- Introduction to Statistics I: STA 2122 or STA 3111 (in other Florida institutions STA 2023)
- Human Biology: BSC 2023 (recommended), BSC 1005, BSC 2010, BSC 2011, BSC 2085, or BSC 2086

Students can opt to select specialized coursework towards:

- Track in Industrial-Organization Psychology
- Verified Course Sequence in Behavior Analysis
